Fee Assistance is accepted at City of Calgary pools, leisure centers and golf courses, Calgary Outdoor Pool Association, Calgary Public Library, Calgary Zoo, Cardel Place, Fort Calgary, Heritage Park, Rotary Challenger Park, Silver Springs Outdoor Pool, South Fish Creek Recreation Association, Talisman Centre, TELUS World of Science/Creative Kids Museum and V.R.R.I.

An application and proof of financial need is required annually. It will take about 2 weeks after receipt of the application for the customer to be issued the Fee Assistance card.

To be ELIGIBLE for Fee Assistance customers must be:

1/ Residents of Calgary (proof of residency may be requested)

AND

2/ Provide proof of financial need

He lost both of his legs to an accident late last year, and the amazing part of his story is that he overcame a number of hurdles and challenges and today finds himself living independently in the community and working towards acceptance to one of the Technical Colleges in Calgary. What has happened to him in 5 short months is nothing short of astonishing and his level of perseverance seems endless. I find myself actually inspired by this individual.

As we move the program forward with 2007 the goal of the program is to enhance relations between Chief and Council and the CPA. I believe that the more people that can be involved in any procedure(s) or decisions, the more success we are going to have in assisting those who need it. So with that in mind, it is important to increase dialogue with Federal Government Departments that assist First Nations peoples too. I will continue this effort also.

I want to close my blurb with a thought. We were invited to conduct an in-service on the Blood Reserve and expressed to them that we would love to host a Peer event for First Nations people throughout Treaty 7 right on the Reserve in Stand Off. I can now transfer from my chair to the edge of the tub onto the stool independently!

I do not have my own physiotherapist but I still like to keep my body in shape. In the top of the picture is an ankle weight (approx. 2lbs). I am an incomplete para and have some movement in my legs. I wear this on my ankles so it adds extra weight when I move my legs, which in turn strengthens my muscles.

In the bottom of the picture is a piece of TheraBand. You can get different strengths. I like to use this to do my upper body exercises.

Long-term motor cortex plasticity induced by an electronic neural implant

It has been proposed that the efficacy of neuronal connections is strengthened when there is a persistent causal relationship between presynaptic and postsynaptic activity. Such activity-dependent plasticity may underlie the reorganization of cortical representations during learning, although direct in vivo evidence is lacking. Here we show that stable reorganization of motor output can be induced by an artificial connection between two sites in the motor cortex of freely behaving primates.
